

- 4 SCIENCE
- 3 SOCIAL STUDIES
- .5 PE/ .5 HEALTH
- 3 MODERN LANGUAGE/FINE ARTS/TECH*
- 4 ELECTIVES**

*Students interested in attending a University of Georgia system school must have 2 consecutive years of the same foreign language in order to be accepted as a freshman.

** If you are planning on taking outside coursework you must meet with Mrs. Keesee for approval. Paperwork and forms are available on the Rivers Academy counseling website.

SIX STEPS TO SUCCESS

STEP 1RESEARCH COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

Research colleges for academic, social, and financial fit.

Consider the size of the school and its location.

Be sure to note the admission requirements, course requirements, and priority deadlines for scholarship consideration.

Create a spreadsheet or chart that you can use to compare the schools.

Ideally, you should have a balanced list with 25% safety schools, 40% target schools, and 35% reach schools - REMEMBER THIS SHOULD BE BASED ON MIDDLE 50% DATA.

COMPLETE YOUR SENIOR PROFILE

- Your senior profile allows Mrs. Keesee and recommending teachers more insight into who you are and provides a summary of your achievements beyond your transcripts.
- Please turn in Senior Profiles to Mrs. Keesee no later than August 31, 2021.

STEP 2 – COMPLETE APPLICATIONS


Determine what types of applications each institution uses: Common App, Coalition for College, GAfutures, independent, etc.

Access applications and obtain admissions checklists for each institution

Common App and Coalition have really simplified the process for their member schools.

They house all components of your application and make sending applications a breeze.

Be sure to note college deadlines and PLAN AHEAD 2-4 weeks in advance.



WHEN TO APPLY



EARLY DECISION - allows a student to apply in the early Fall for an early determination of admissibility. BINDING!



EARLY ACTION- invites early applications but does not require the student to attend if accepted.



ROLLING ADMISSION- the applicant is notified as soon as the application has been processed and the file is complete.



OPEN ADMISSION- students are notified of acceptance upon application (community colleges)

STEP 3 – ORDER SAT AND ACT SCORES

Check to see which scores your college requires. Does it require any subject tests?

Some schools will ask for self-reporting of scores. MAKE SURE YOU ARE ACCURATE!

Scores must be ordered from the testing websites.

Mrs. Keesee is your acting counselor.



Counselor and teacher recommendations should be requested (if asked for by the college) at least two weeks ahead of deadlines.



Mrs. Keesee will provide a copy of your senior profile to all your teachers which will help expediate the process.

STEP 5 – TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS

If you are applying through Common App, Coalition, or GAfutures, be sure to put Rivers Academy as your school to request a transcript.

If you are applying to an independent school, then you will need to request transcripts through Parchment.

Parchment is a simple way to request transcripts to be sent to other schools, potential employers and other entities.

BE SURE TO CHECK HOW YOUR SCHOOL WANTS TRANSCRIPTS SENT.

HOW TO REQUEST A TRANSCRIPT THROUGH PARCHMENT

- 1. Create a Parchment account. You DO NOT need a Registration Code.
- 2. Log into your Parchment account.
- 3. Go to Orders/Request. Click Transcripts.
- 4. Search for and select destination.
- 5. Confirm destination and delivery
- 6. Submit payment if necessary.
- 7. Request is confirmed.
- 8. Track your order through your Parchment account. Click Transcripts. Click Order History.
- *** If you are over 18, you must request your own transcript.
- *** A parent may not request a transcript for you.



STEP 6 -COMPLETE FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS: FIRST STEPS

Familiarize

Familiarize yourself with the information needed for the FAFSA and CCS applications by visiting the websites. Check open application dates and deadlines. Start gathering needed documentation.

FAFSA

- Provided by the federal government
- Provides available federal aid option
- General financial questions/annual income
- Does not take student contribution into account
- Free

CSS Profile

https://cssprofile.collegeboard.org/

- Provided by CollegeBoard, a non-profit
- Provides non-federal aid options
- More specific financial questions/personal assets
- Takes student contribution into account
- \$25 to fill out forms and submit to 1 school; \$16 for every additional school

HOPE VS. ZELL MILLER SCHOLARSHIP

HOPE

- Must be a legal resident of GA
- Must be a graduate of an eligible high school with 4 units of rigor
- A GPA of 3.0 in core courses
- Must maintain a 3.0 GPA in college
- If male, must have registered for selective service

Zell Miller

- Must be a legal resident of GA
- Must be a graduate of an eligible high school with 4 units of rigor
- A GPA of 3.7 in core courses AND 1200 SAT or 26 ACT
- Must maintain a 3.3 GPA in college
